OSOM is unique. It provides students with the benefit of up to a semester of college credit (18 credit hours) through its partnership with the Southeastern University (SEU) Ohio Network Campus. This is available to students who have completed each level of the OSOM program with transfer credit of up to 6 credit hours (2 courses) per credentialing level.

Course credits from OSOM for SEU Ohio Network Campus Students Undergraduate Students:
Up to two SEU courses per OSOM level: certified, licensed, and ordained.

Certified level: 2 courses (6 credit hours)
Licensed level: 4 courses (12 credit hours)
Ordained level: 6 courses (18 credit hours)

Potential Value: \$7,685
